Disaster Prevention

These are activities designed to provide permanent protection from disasters. Not all disasters, particularly natural disasters, can be prevented, but the risk of life and injury can be mitigated with good evacuation plans, environmental planning and design standards. In January 2005,168 Governments adopted a 10- Years global plan for natural disaster risk reduction called the Hyogo Framework. It offers guiding principles, priorities for action, and practical means for achieving disaster resilience for vulnerable communities.

Disaster Preparedness:-

The activities are designed to minimize loss of life damage - for example by removing people and property from a threatened location and by facilitating timely and effective rescue, relief and property from a threatened location and management should be a high priority in physical therapy practice managements.

Disaster relief:-

This is a coordinated multi-agency response to reduce the impact of a disaster and its long - term result. Relief activities include, rescue, providing disease and disability, repairing vital services such as telecommunications and transport, providing temporary
